

Supercalifragilistic expialidocious Facts about Mary Poppins

- 1.) It took more than 20 years to convince the author of Mary Poppins (P.L. Travers) to sell the movie rights.
- 2.) Julie Andrews and Dick Van Dyke weren't the only options for the lead roles. Angela Lansbury and Bette Davis were also considered for the role of Mary. Cary Grant was Walt Disney's pick for Bert.
- **3.)** Julie Andrews almost passed on the movie. Because she had originated the role on Broadway, Andrews was hoping to be cast as Eliza Doolittle in My Fair Lady, so she didn't accept Disney's offer right away.
- 4.) Dick Van Dyke's cockney accent has been named one of the worst accent attempts in film history.
- 5.) "A Spoonful of Sugar" was inspired by the Polio Vaccine. Composer Robert Sherman's son had received his polio vaccine at school one day and informed his dad that it hadn't hurt at all; the medicine was simply placed on a sugar cube and they ate it like candy.
- **6.) Walt Disney's favorite song was "Feed the Birds."** Not just his favorite song from the movie--his favorite song. Richard Sherman has said on several occasions that Walt would stop by the Sherman Brothers office every Friday and request a private performance.
- **7.) P.L. Travers hated the movie with a passion.** Though Travers was given script approval, she wasn't given final script approval. She vowed that she would never work with Disney again.
- 8.) Disney was sued over Supercalif ragilistic expialidocious. Though the Sherman Brothers claimed they made the word up themselves, a 1949 song would seem to say otherwise. The writers of the 'original' song sued for \$12 million. They lost because lawyers were able to present evidence showing that the nonsense word had been around, in some form or another, for decades.
- **9.)** There was almost a Mary Poppins ride. Due to the popularity of the movie, a Mary Poppins ride was to be installed at the Magic Kingdom instead of Peter Pan's Flight.
- 10.) Disney won 5 of the 13 Academy Awards for which Mary Poppins was nominated.

## **Tony Capps (Choreographer)**



#### **DIRECTOR'S NOTES**

Come feed the little birds, Show them you care, And you'll be glad if you do. Their young ones are hungry, Their nests are so bare, All it takes is tuppence from you. Feed the birds, tuppence a bag, Tuppence, tuppence, tuppence a bag.

The Broadway musical of Mary Poppins contains numerous examples of ingenious imagining and reimagining. One of the greatest occurs with "Feed the Birds." Following a scene at George's office--a bank of intimidating proportions--in which Jane asks a single pointed question of her father about recognizing value, Mary takes Jane and Michael past St. Paul's Cathedral. On its steps they meet the Bird Woman. Jane is ready to dismiss this old lady in rags, but Mary makes sure the children stop and listen to her. The words resonate deeply, personally, and in new ways in the stage version, following the interactions and transactions that have just occured at the bank. The song, now more clearly than ever, articulates something essential to this story and to us, the audience: small gestures of kindness, rather than monetary transactions, fill our lives with joy, satisfaction, and meaning.

With "Feed the Birds," as in so many other songs and moments in the show, the writers have placed the Banks family in a world not just of magic, but also of real people, real challenges, and real history. The Banks are in need of Mary Poppins' care and attention, but there is an entire world of people (and other living creatures) around them in need of equal care and attention.

The stage adaptation is not a replica of the film, but an original musical that honors some of its greatest achievements and most beloved moments. The screenwriters gave P.L. Travers' fantastic (in all senses) stories a plot: The Banks need Mary Poppins to nanny their children because they need to learn how to be a family. The stage adaptation builds upon this, giving Winifred Banks a fuller storyline, George Banks a backstory, the children a bit more room to grow from spoiled and bratty to kind and thoughtful. Ultimately, the goal was to bring Mary Poppins' magic to something that is both familiar and new.


