The second team didn't do so good and at the half the score was 26-14. The final score was 54-19 for Mt. Zion. Patterson was high point man with 8 points.

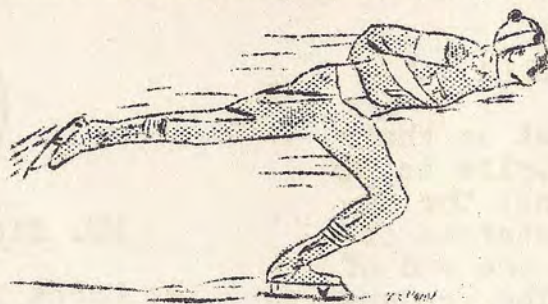
