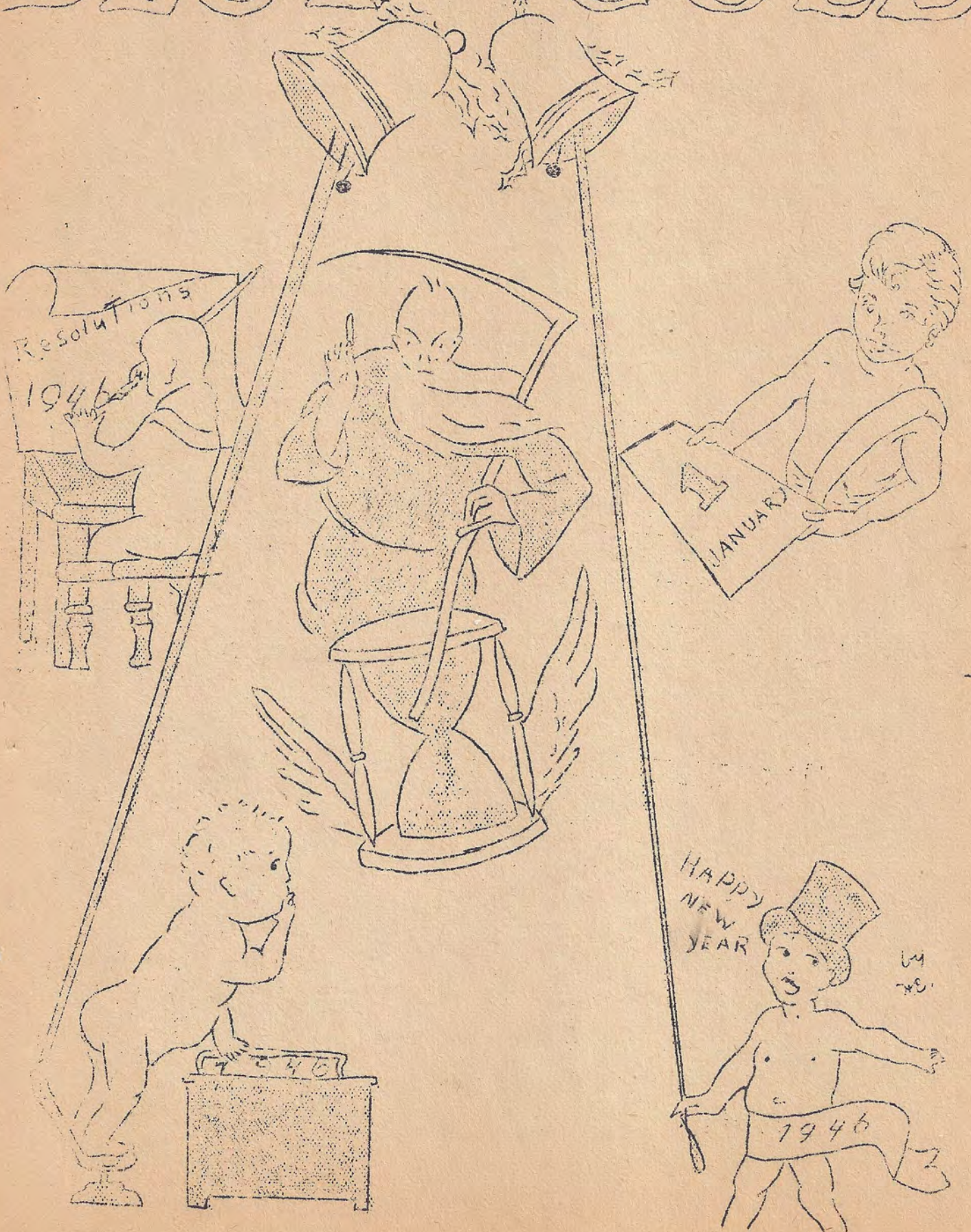
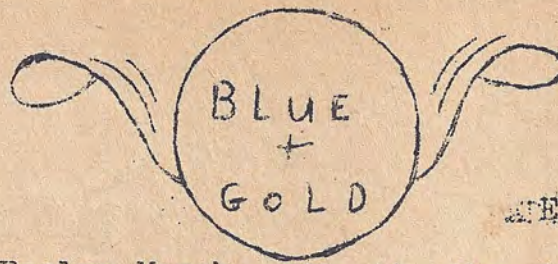

Onions to Dave K. and Bonnie S. We haven't seen you around much anymore. No trouble between you, I hope!

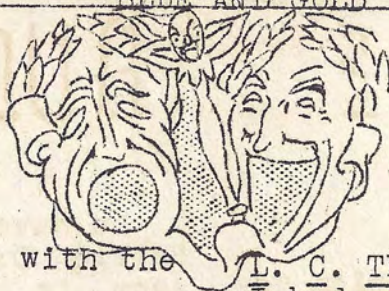
Orchids to Jeannette and Richard. It seems as though they are making a little progress. They are speaking to each other now!!

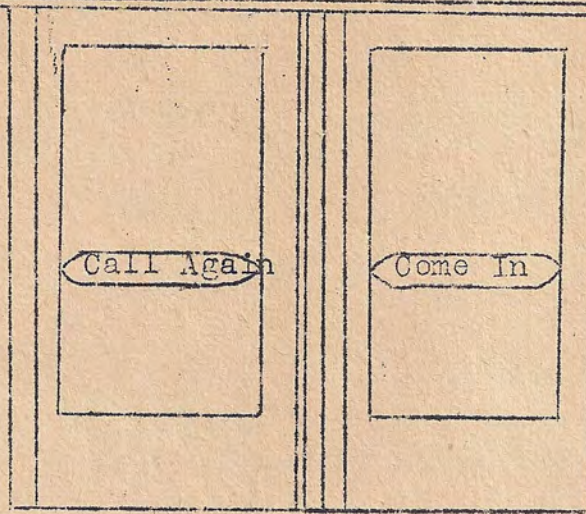
