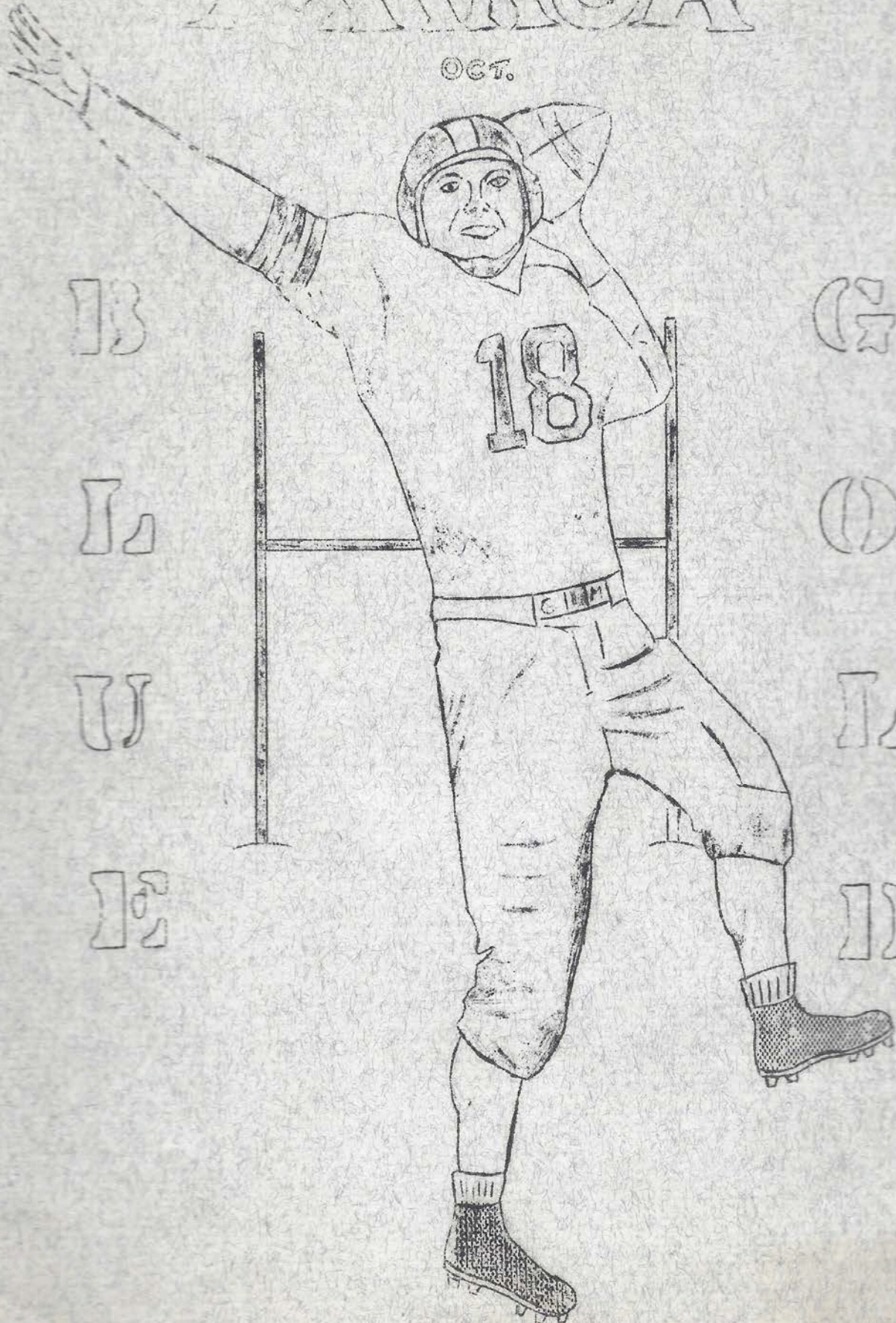

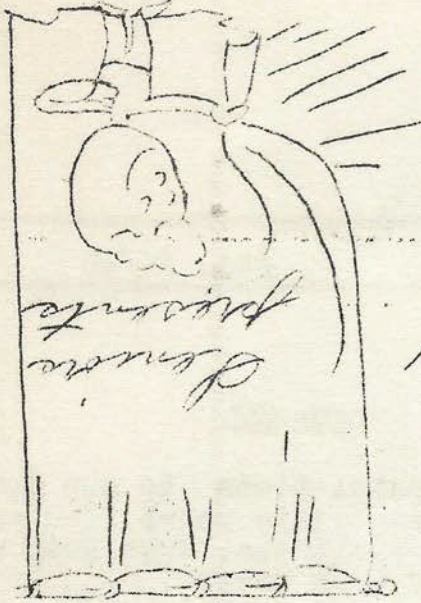

Pop said, "My son has a birth-mark on his arm. It is a long back mark Shag looked at him and asked, "What is your last name?" Pop said, "It is Smith."

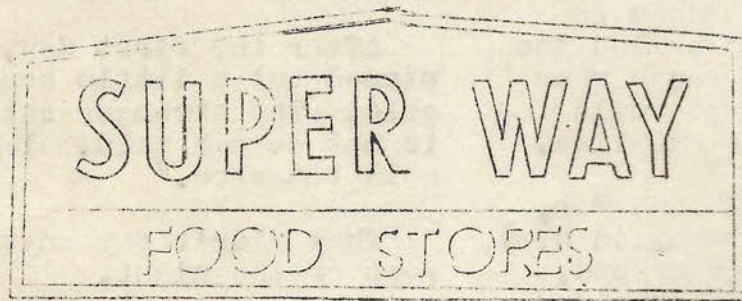
Shag said that was his name to. Then Pop said, "You are my son. I though that you were dead

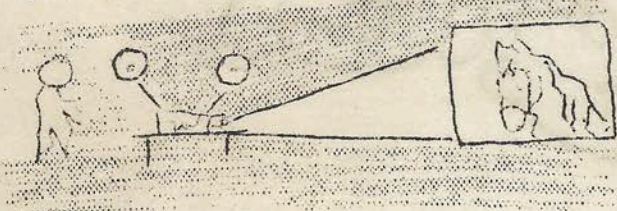
Now we are hard at work on our float for homecoming which is Friday, October 22.

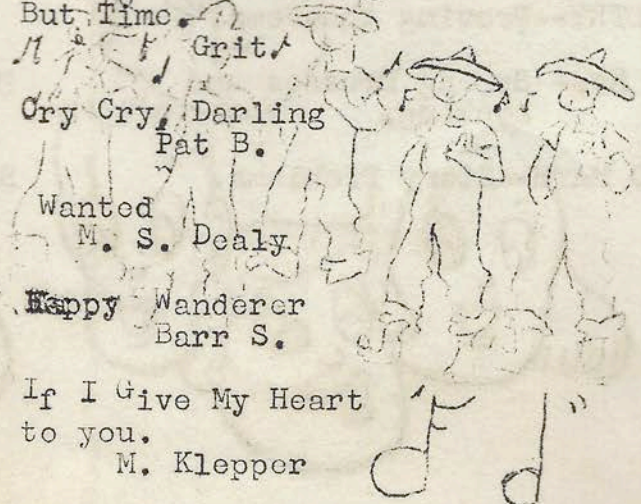

FRSH.-SOPH. LOSE TO BETHANY

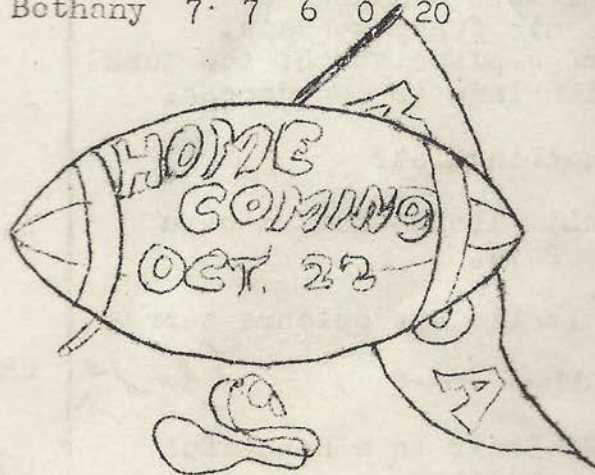
The Maroa fresh-Soph team lost to Bethany Fresh-Soph by a score of 20-13.

Due to the win, Maroa kept a tight grip on first place in the Soya Conference race with a 3-0 record. They now have a 4-1 record for the season.

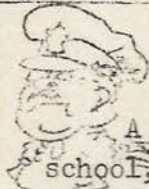
