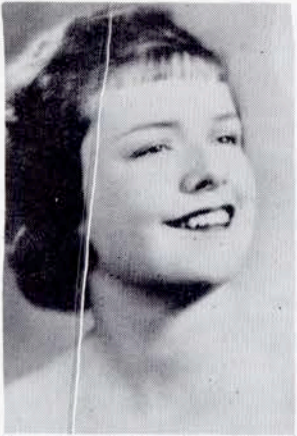


**CAROL MERRIFIELD
WINS DAR AWARD**



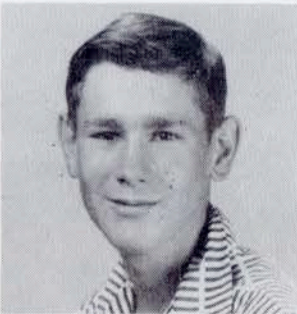

**Jenna McMillen Wins 1960
Homemaker of Tomorrow**



Jenna McMillen, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. W. N. McMillen, 11 North McDonald Avenue, Decatur, Illinois, has been named the 1960 Betty Crocker Homemaker of Tomorrow for Maroa-Forsyth High School.

She received the highest score in a 50-minute written examination on homemaking knowledge and attitudes taken by graduating senior girls. The examination paper will be submitted with other high school winners to determine the state Betty Crocker Homemaker of Tomorrow.

The test, which is prepared and judged by Science Research Associates of Chicago, was taken by a record number of 379,018 girls in 12,597 schools.

Each state winner will receive a \$1,500 scholarship and an educational trip April 23-29 with her school advisor. The tour will include New York City and Colonial Williamsburg and will culminate with the American Table Banquet in Washington D. C., on April 28, at the Statler Hilton Hotel where the All-American Homemaker of Tomorrow will be announced. The runner-up in each state will receive a \$500 scholarship; the school of each state winner will be given a set of the Encyclopedia Britannica.

Jenna has been very active in the Future Homemakers of America at Maroa-Forsyth High School and has served as president for the past two years.

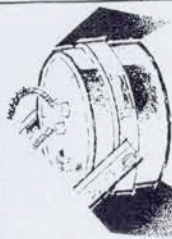
I send a special valentine

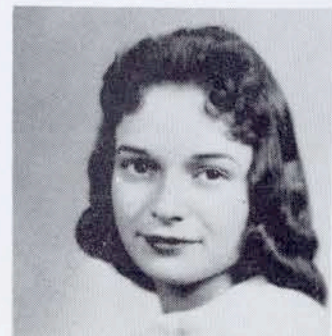

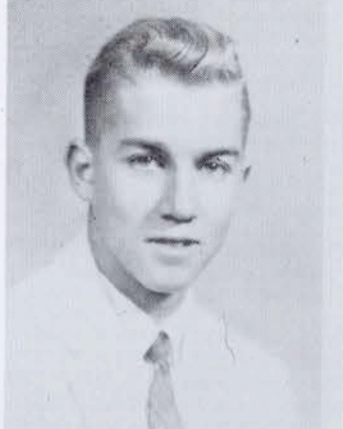
She especially enjoys writing letters, listening to Running Bear and to Pat Boone sing.

This blond haired boy likes pizza, playing pool, and teasing Chub as his favorite pastimes. In the future he plans to go to work.

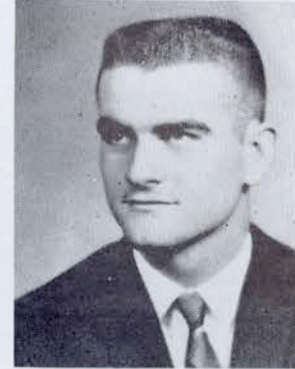

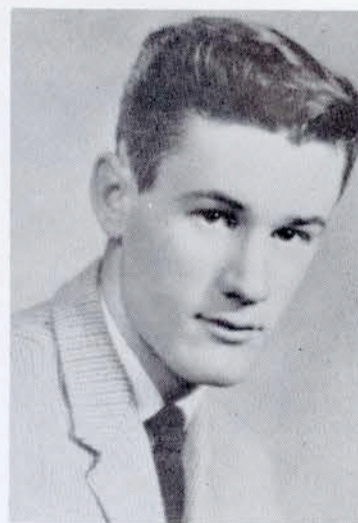
Is it true that you are very fond of mice, Miss Traxler? Sorry folks, but our witness has just fainted. . . .

It was an enjoyable treat for those who attended (especially those who got to taste the frosting).

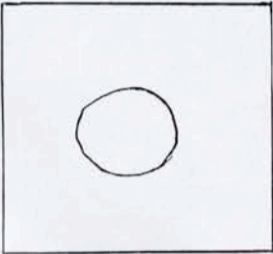
FHA Initiation Held February 4th

Hot Lunches Served By FHA February 4

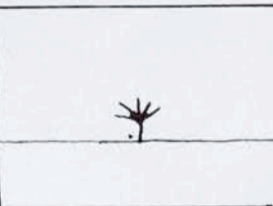

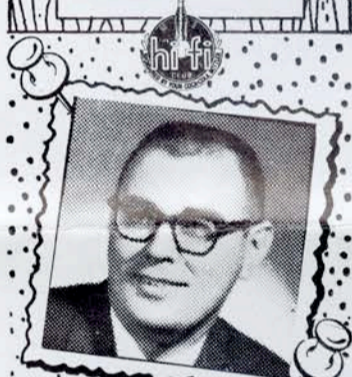
The FFA members have elected Connie Perkins as Chapter Sweetheart for this year. She will be presented her sweetheart jacket at the banquet to be held on March 16.

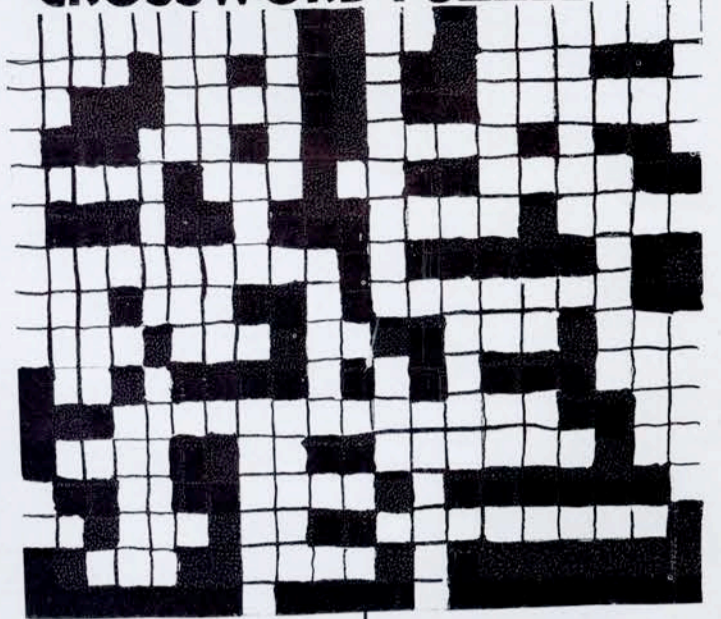

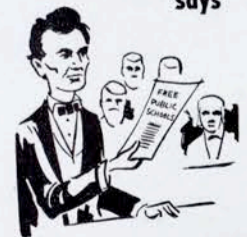
