**TEACHER OF THE MONTH**

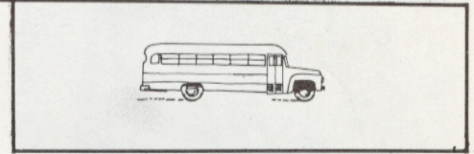

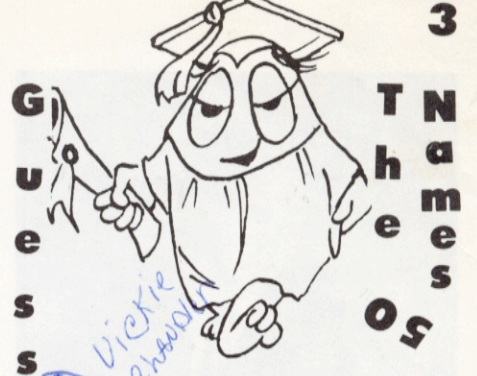
Dear Hey Culligan Man!

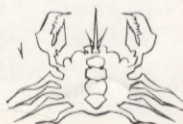
