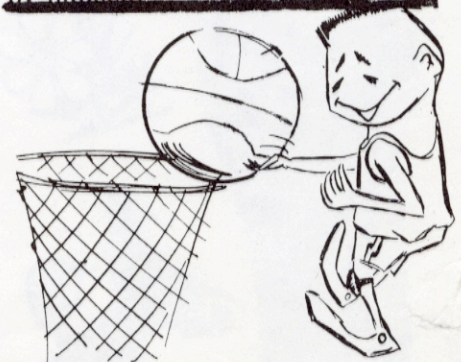

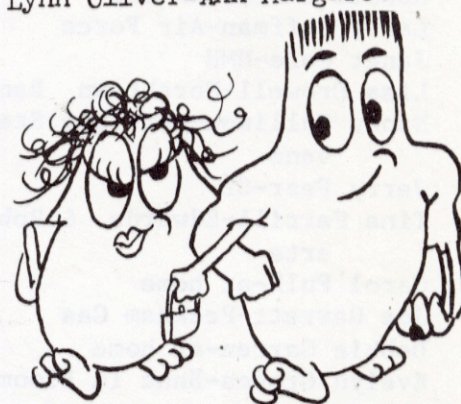


Would you believe it if . .

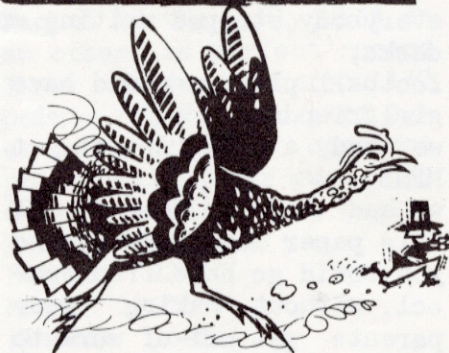
