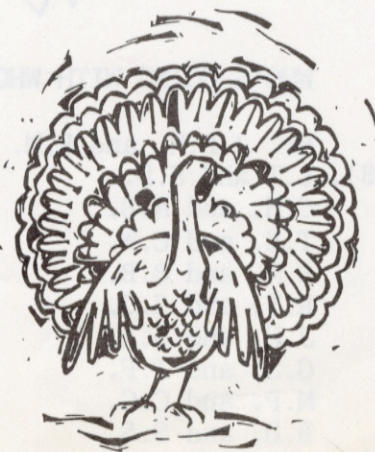

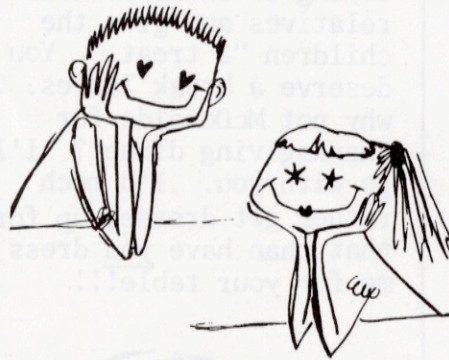
K.B. and L.A. had their #1 year anniversary on Nov. 12th.
