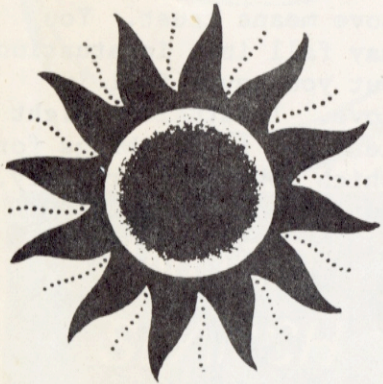
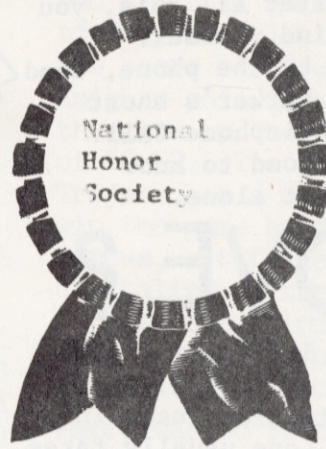

The vote was based on leadership as well as scholarship. Congratulations!

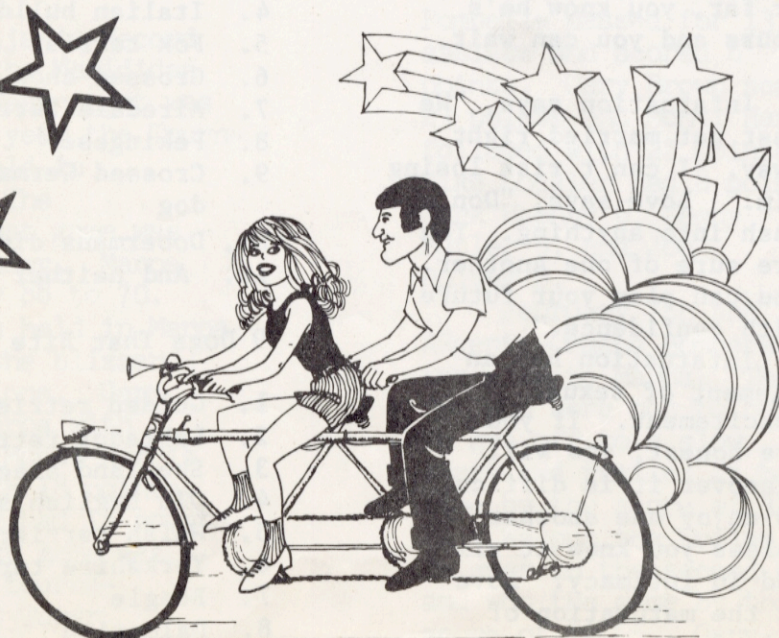

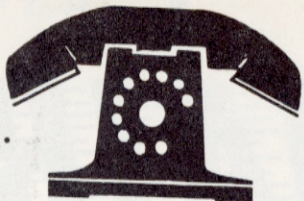

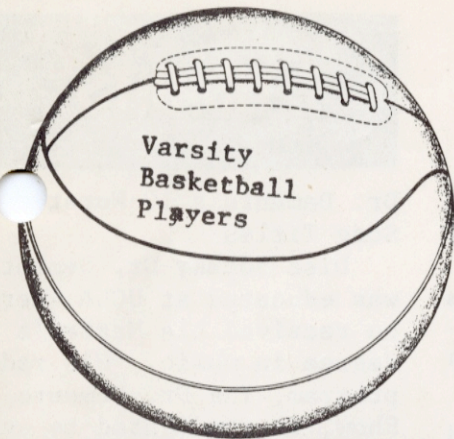

The Trojan's Record going into the Meridian Conference Tournament was 10-4. This year the Tournament was held in Lovington. The Trojan's first game was against Bethany. Maroa beat Bethany 88 to 70. The game was held in Maroa because of the blizzard-like conditions. Gary Brown led Maroa with 23 points. Monti Harris followed with 18 points. Kenny Butler had 16 points.

The next game was outside the tournament against Tower Hill. The Trojans

stomped the Tigers by the score of 77 to 35. Mark Haenny and Gary Brown led the Trojans with 16 points. Kenny Butler had 14 points.

In the semi-final game the Trojans were to play the Blue Mound Knights. The first quarter score was tied up at 13-13, and the ball game was all tied up at half time by the score of 24-24. The Knights pulled away to win the game by the score of 60-52. The Trojans had a chance to win the game by free throws, but failed to capitalize on the chance.

In the third place game in the Tournament was against Illiopolis.

Maroa was to revenge the 68-57 loss on January 6th. The force was with the Trojans as they won 71-63. Brown and Butler led the team with 18 points. Rick Fombelle had 15 points and Harris and Lockler had 10 points apiece.

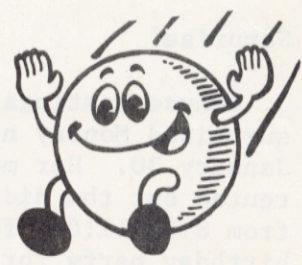
February 3rd the Stonington basketball team traveled to Maroa. The Trojans jumped to a 24-10 first quarter lead. The Trojans had no trouble the rest of the game and rolled to a 72-48 win. Rick Fombelle passed for 13 assists and scored 6 points. Gary Brown scored 23 points and Monti Harris followed with 22 points. Mike Lockler had 8 points, Mark Haenny 6, Kenny Butler 5, and Joe Hulvey 2.

February 7th the Argenta-Oreana Bombers traveled to Maroa. The Trojans were hot to be beaten. We got off to a slow start and trailed at half time by the score of 32-28. We put the Trojan team in gear in the second half and won the game by the score of 70-55. Gary Brown scored 30 points to puce the Trojans. Rick

Fombelle passed to 12 assists and scored two buckets. Monti Harris hit 16 points, Mike Lockler scored 10, Kenny Butler scored 8.

February 10th the Trojans went to Lovington to play a Meridian Conference game. The players of Maroa were "on" and we ripped the Panthers 87-62, although our defense could have been better. Monti Harris led the Trojans with 29 points and Gary Brown followed with 21. Rick Fombelle passed for many assists and scored 8 points. Ken Butler had 10 points, Hulvey 4, Rick Patterson 3, Haenny 2, and Jeff Dash 1 point.

The Findley Falcons traveled to Maroa February 15th. Maroa prevailed 84-40. The scoring; Harris 14, Butler 12, Haenny 11, Brown 10, Hulvey 10, R. Patterson 6, Lockler 6, Dash 4, Fombelle 4, B. Patterson 4, and Garner 3. The Trojans overall record is now 16-5. The Conference Record is 6-3.

Denyse Hastings was very surprised Monday night, January 30. Her mother rented out the Hideaway from 8:00-11:00, for a birthday party for Denyse.

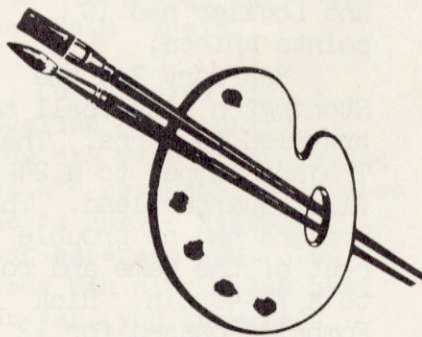
She had no idea of the party.
