



Scientists studying the Shroud of Turin say that the cloth is no hoax. They say that the cloth may not be the 2000 year old burial cloth of Christ because they cannot prove that the image on the cloth was made by a real body. They say that mathematically, the image was formed by a body shape underneath the cloth. This past weekend scientists at Los Almos Scientific Laboratory gathered all their findings to come up with some theories for the shroud, which is fourteen feet long and has been kept in a Roman Catholic chapel for the
