It involves many area farm
families. For instance,
David Berry says that his
family would not support
this type of action. He

would not benefit from an
embargo.

Scott Cunningham said that his family felt sorry for President Carter, but were dissapointed that Carter would take this step after promising that he wouldn't do so. He explained that with corn costing \$2.20 a bushel that the farmer is

making only 10¢ profit when the corn is selling for only \$2.30 per bushel. At these prices, one could make only a \$15.00 profit per acre.

Joy Malone said that the embargo has really put a damper on the grain market now that Russia, our biggest buyer is out of the picture.

From the indications in these viewpoints, the reaction from this area may tend to be unfavorable in this move by the President.
